## Hello and welcome

to the Spring edition of our *Contact* magazine. Thank you very much for your continued support for our parish. We value your prayerful and practical support as we seek to live out our calling to love God and love our neighbour as ourselves.

I have now been at Saint Molua's for just over six months, and my family and I are very grateful for the warm welcome we have received. We have really enjoyed becoming part of the life of the parish.

As I reflect on the past few months, I do so with mixed emotions. In my short time here, we have had four funerals. It has been sad to say goodbye to Audrey Ryan, Kenneth Douglas, Lorna Donaldson and, most recently, Phyllis Jackson. At the same time, it has been a privilege to meet their families and hear the many stories of their faithfulness to this church over the years. Their lives remind us of the quiet and steady ways in which God's people serve Him and one another.

As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.”*

This is a more informal service where we take time to explore some of the difficult seasons of life; times of loneliness, burnout, doubt or waiting, considering what Scripture teaches us about meeting God in those places. These evenings include worship, teaching and space for reflection and prayer, and it has been encouraging to see people coming together to support one another as we walk through life's wilderness seasons.

Alongside this, many of our regular ministries and gatherings continue week by week, offering opportunities for fellowship, learning and service. We are grateful for everyone who gives their time and energy to make these things possible, and we pray that all we do as a parish would help people grow in faith and encounter the love of Christ.

As we look ahead to the coming months, my hope and prayer is that Saint Molua's will continue to be a place where people find welcome, encouragement and hope. Whether you are a long-standing member of the parish or someone who is simply curious about faith, we're so glad you're here.

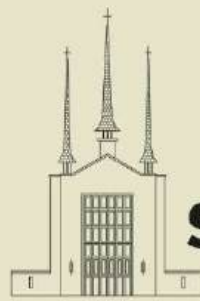
## Update from Tullycarnet Church

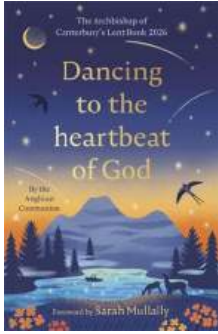

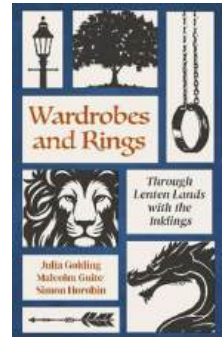


**Dancing to the Heartbeat of God:** Stories of Discipleship. Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book 2026, SPCK, Dec 25

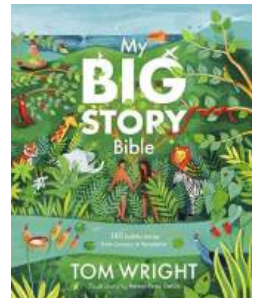

Marietta warmed us all up with her armchair aerobics in January, and our



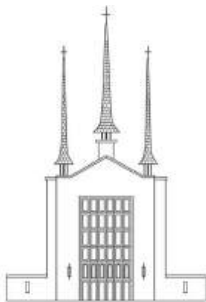
